SUPPORT TXDOT'S SHORT LINE RAIL FUNDING REQUEST

The Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) has included a **\$25 million funding request** in its 2026-2027 Legislative Appropriations for vital short line railroad projects. The funding will address critical challenges such as:

- Building new track.
- Enhancing existing railways and ties.
- Upgrading bridges.
- Increasing capacity and weather resiliency.
- Promoting safety enhancements.

The time is now to modernize Texas' short line rail network and meet the needs of a growing state.

WHY ARE SHORT LINES VITAL TO TEXAS' ECONOMY?

Forty-five short line railroads cover 2,570 miles across 80 counties, connecting rural areas to national freight networks and driving economic growth. Key economic impacts include:

State-Level Contributions

- 1,476 jobs annually.
- \$113.7 million in labor income.
- \$354.4 million in economic output.

County-Level Contributions

- 1,136 jobs annually.
- \$87.8 million in labor income.
- \$274.9 million in economic output


WHY IS FUNDING CRITICAL?
